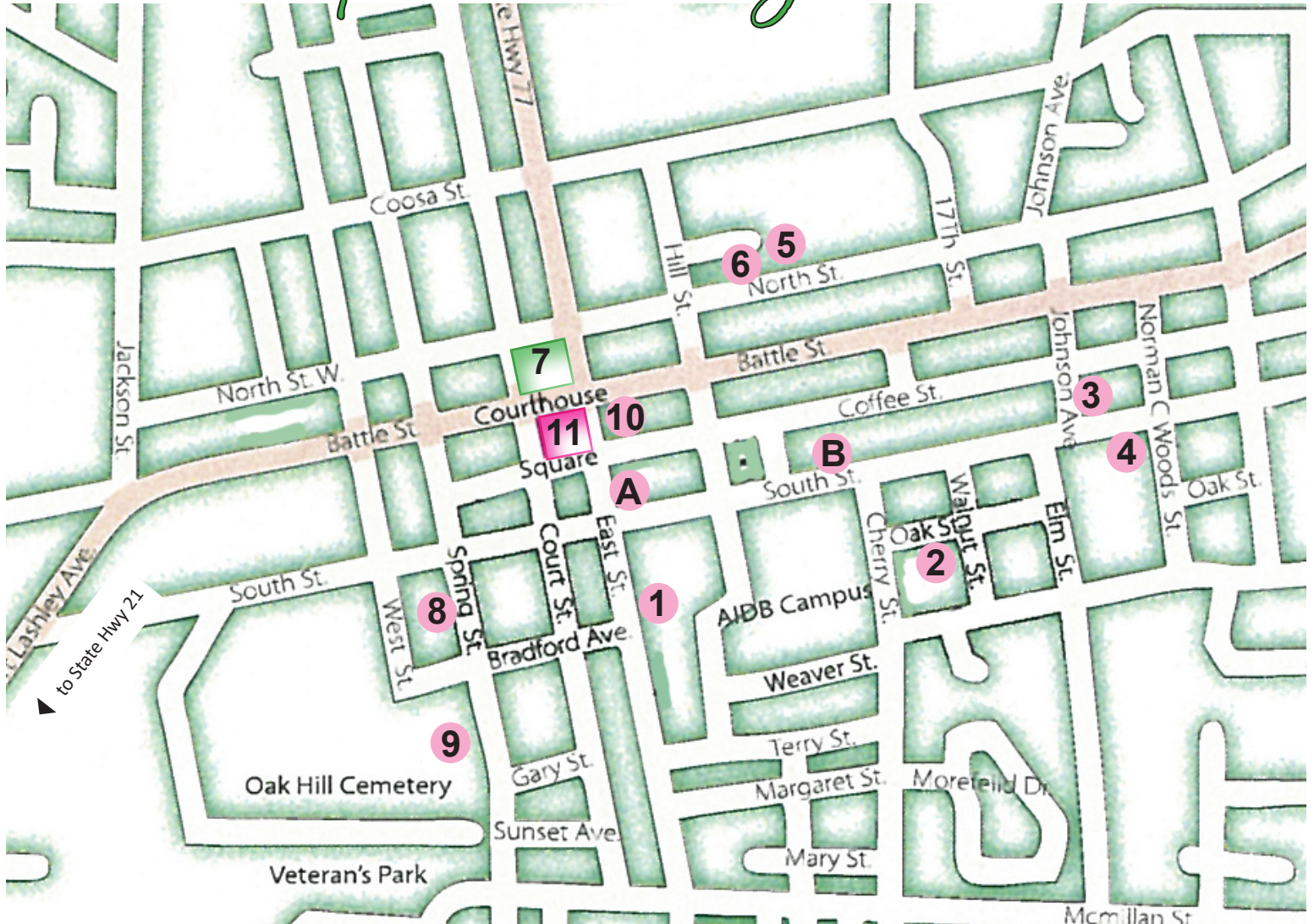

The “Ghosts of Talladega” Cemetery Tour is an annual part of April in Talladega where citizens of the past are brought back to life in Oak Hill Cemetery. Visitors learn through the “ghosts” about their life and history in Talladega.
Oak Hill Cemetery was established in 1831, three years before the town of Talladega was incorporated, and more than a year before Talladega County was created on December 18, 1832. Graven images stand silent vigil over 33 acres in one of Alabama’s oldest and most significant cemeteries. Walking around the cemetery and reading the headstones can be as informative as reading a history book. Uniquely, beginning with the Revolutionary War, there are veterans from every American conflict entrusted to Oak Hill.

In Talladega where antebellum homes abound, a surprising jewel of the City for art and history lovers is Jemison-Carnegie Heritage Hall Museum. This elegant building, built in 1906 was originally the Talladega Public Library, a product of Andrew Carnegie’s nationwide library construction program.
